# New Unofficial Election Night Results

Using the PMD for Unofficial Results

# Close of Polls

- Poll Workers close polls on scanner
- PMD is removed from scanner
- PMD is placed in ziploc bag and sealed



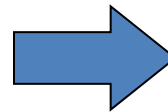
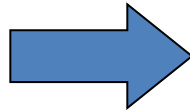
# Close of Polls

- Sealed PMD is placed in yellow pouch
- Yellow pouch is sealed
- Yellow pouches from each scanner are placed in large yellow bag
- Yellow bag is sealed



# Close of Polls

- Coordinator hands yellow bag to Police Officer
- Police Officer goes to precinct and hands off the yellow bag to a bi-partisan team of Election Night Reporting (ENR) Clerks



# Unofficial Results

- ENR Clerks scan bag using RFID technology to confirm all PMDs are present
- ENR Clerks insert PMDs into laptop and transmit the Unofficial Results



# Unofficial Results

- Laptops at Precincts transmits unofficial results to SFTP Server
- ERM Servers retrieve unofficial results from SFTP Server

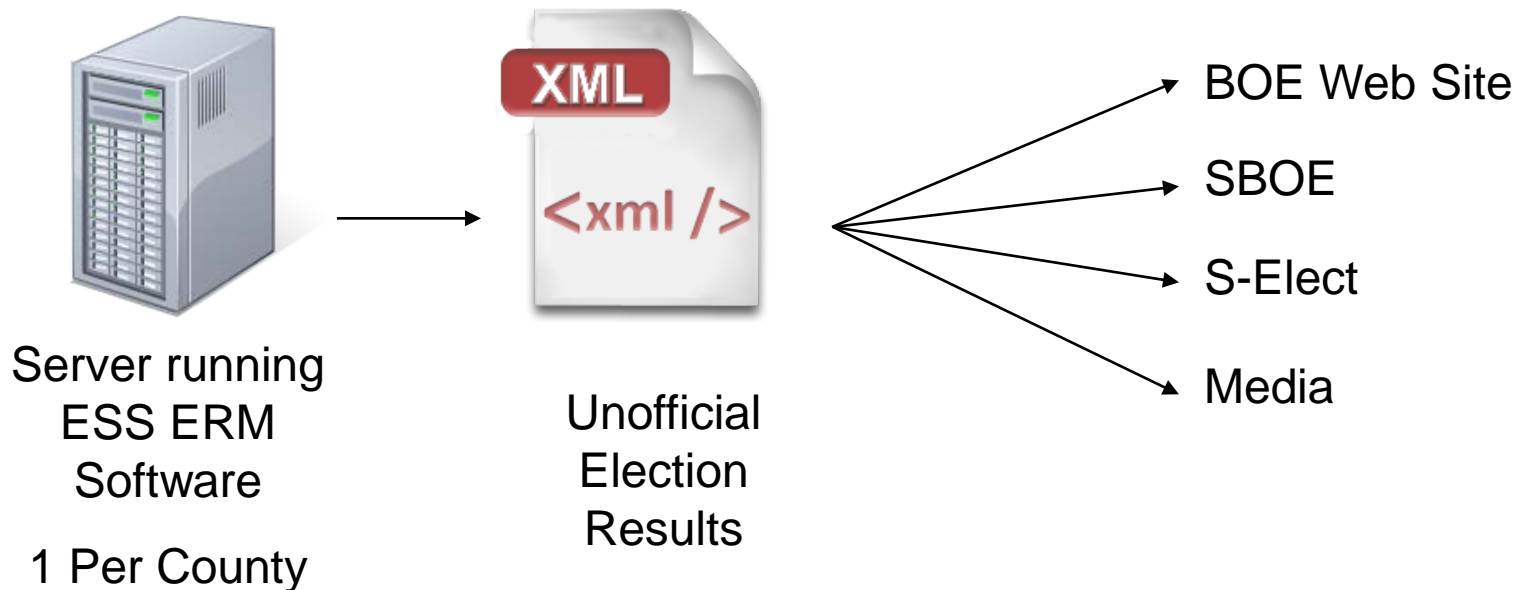

# Unofficial Results

- Periodically during Election Night, XML files are created on the ERM Servers and are electronically transferred to the BOE's web site, State Board of Elections, Board's central election management system (S-Elect) and the media.



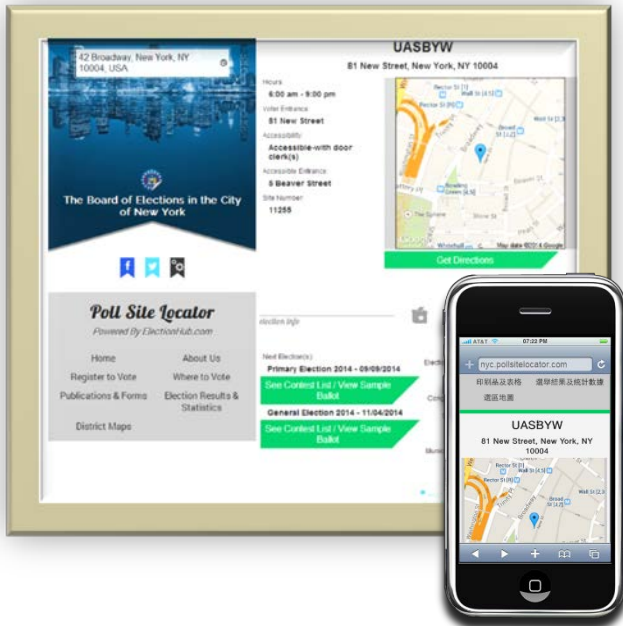
# Web-based applications for voters, poll workers and technicians

# M-Elect

- Starting in 2013, the NYCBOE began to develop a suite of web-based applications to enhance various areas of the voting experience
- Web-based applications are device independent
- Applications include:
  - ❖ Online Poll Site locator
  - ❖ Poll Worker web portal
  - ❖ Election Day incident reporting, dispatching and resolution system

# M-Elect - Pollsitelocator.com

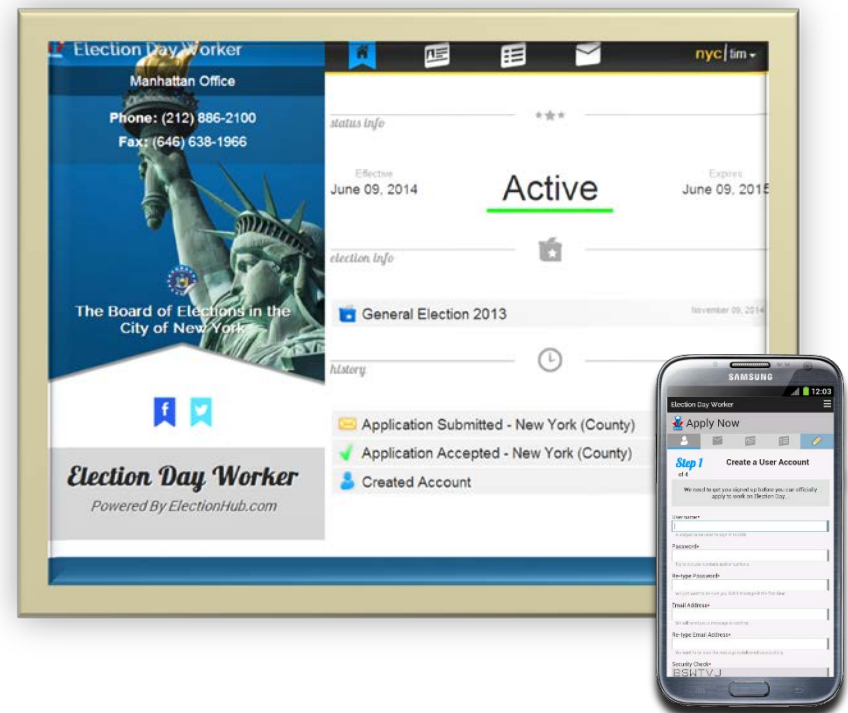


- Allows a voter to lookup their poll site and receive turn by turn directions (walking or driving)
- Allows an Information Clerk to lookup a voter's Election District and if necessary, direct the voter to their correct poll site

- Provides list of Candidates specific to the voter
- Provides a sample of the Election Day Ballot

# M-Elect - Electiondayworker.com

- Allows residents of New York City to sign up to be a standby poll worker
  - ❖ Inspector
  - ❖ Information Clerk
  - ❖ Interpreter
  - ❖ Door Clerk
- Allows a poll worker to:
  - ❖ renew their application for the upcoming Poll Worker year
  - ❖ see their Training and Work assignments



# M-Elect - Electionresponder.com

- Improves upon existing phone-based Call Center operation
- Technicians and Poll Site Monitors utilize mobile devices to report:
  - ❖ Poll Site Incidents
  - ❖ Poll Site Resolutions
- Staff are assigned Poll Sites and app automatically generates a route for them to follow based on distance to next poll site
- App provides detailed information on poll site
  - ❖ Schematic (Route from the Curb to the poll room)
  - ❖ Floor Plan (Layout of Equipment – Scanners, Privacy Booths, BMD)
  - ❖ Number of Election Districts
  - ❖ Number of scanners and serial numbers
  - ❖ Number of Ballot Marking Devices and serial numbers
  - ❖ Poll Worker staffing



# Future of M-Elect

- Allow Poll Workers to:
  - ❖ Schedule their training class
  - ❖ Notify NYCBOE if they are unable to work Election Day
  - ❖ Take online training courses and complete quizzes
  - ❖ Receive Notices to Work and Notices to Train by email
  - ❖ Send and receive messages to/from the NYCBOE on Election Day
  - ❖ Receive notification of when their payroll has been processed
  
- Allow Coordinators to retrieve poll site information including:
  - ❖ Poll Worker staffing and contact information
  - ❖ Site Schematic
  - ❖ Floor Plans
  - ❖ Last Minute Special Instructions
  - ❖ ADA Compliance Information
  
- Incorporation of Electionresponder.com into an on-site device allowing:
  - ❖ Real-time tracking of ADA Compliance
  - ❖ Reporting of Poll Site Incidents including request for Standby Poll Workers and supplies
  - ❖ Reducing paperwork and improving response time on Election Day

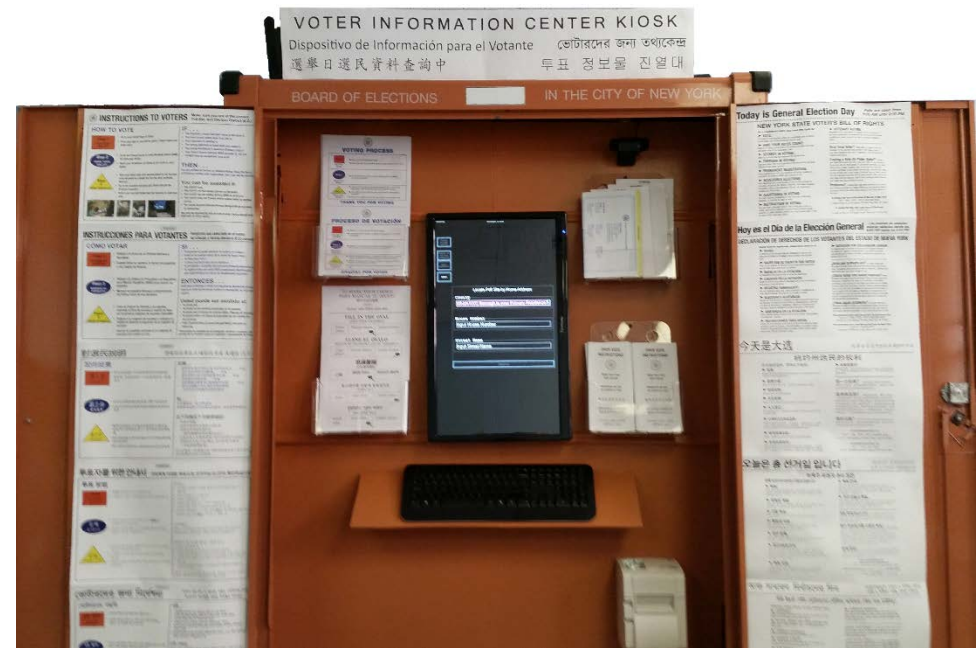

# Voter Information Center Kiosk (VICKi)

VICKi currently provides three main functions at a Poll Site:

- Electronic Street Finder / Poll Site Locator
- Poll Worker Check-In
- Unofficial Election Night Results Reporting



# Voter Information Center Kiosk (VICKi)

## Electronic Street Finder / Poll Site Locator

- Voters enter their address and are informed (using GPS) if they are in the correct Poll Site
- If not, provides a map and directions to their correct poll site
- Ability for voter to print turn by turn directions (Walking or Driving)

# Voter Information Center Kiosk (VICKi)

## Poll Worker Check-In



- Allows poll workers to check-in by scanning their Notice to Work and receive a confirmation receipt
- Allows NYCBOE to monitor staffing at Poll Sites decreasing the amount of calls into the NYCBOE Call Center
- Allows NYCBOE to proactively deploy standby poll workers
- Allows NYCBOE to complete poll worker payroll efficiently

# Voter Information Center Kiosk (VICKi)

## Unofficial Election Night Results Reporting

- After the Polls close, the system would be used as an ENR terminal allowing unofficial results to be transmitted directly from the Poll Site
- Expected to provide earlier unofficial results reporting

Processing PMD Sticks  
-----

1. Insert PMD into USB port [ Black / Green ]
2. Wait for PMD to be detected [ Yellow ]
3. Saving PMD [ Red ]
4. Saving PMD Completed [ Green ]
5. Continue with step 1 for next PMD

Completion of Processing PMD Sticks  
-----

1. Check "PMD Read" equals "PMD Sent"
2. Check "Remaining" equals 0
3. Click "Exit"
